

Two Tenure Eligible Faculty Positions:

Full or Associate Professors in the Colorado SPH,

Department of Environmental and Occupational Health

The Colorado School of Public Health seeks two full-time, tenure-track faculty in the Department of Environmental and Occupational Health. We seek applicants who will increase the diversity of our faculty and who have expertise in cross-disciplinary research and teaching in the following areas: Climate and Health, Built Environment, Total Worker Health, and Emergency Preparedness and Resilience. Applicants outside these specific areas of interest are also encouraged to apply if they can articulate a vision for their research and explain how their interests and expertise complement existing strengths within the department. Ideal applicants will also have a demonstrated commitment to promoting diversity and effective mentoring of the next generation of leaders in the field of Environmental and Occupational Health.

These are 12-month tenure-eligible research and teaching positions. The ideal candidates will have an established funded research program, enjoy working in a collaborative and interdisciplinary team environment, and have a commitment to graduate level teaching and mentoring. Excellent collaboration opportunities exist within the Department and throughout the School of Public Health as well as at CU School of Medicine, CU School of Pharmacy, University of Colorado Denver Downtown and Boulder Campuses, Colorado State University, National Jewish Health, and with the many Federal Partners with regional headquarters in the Denver metropolitan area. We anticipate hiring one Full and one Associate Professor. Rank at the time of appointment will be commensurate with experience.

Review of applications will begin on March 1, 2016 and continue until the positions are filled.

Applicants for these positions should demonstrate a potential for high-quality teaching and continuing a vigorous a sponsored research program. Candidates should submit a CV, a one to two page statement outlining research and teaching interests, and the names of three to five professional references.
