This position serves as an STD Epidemiologist with the Indiana Department of Health. The epidemiologist conducts routine surveillance for sexually transmitted diseases (STD), investigates outbreaks of STD, recommends control measures, and analyzes and interprets STD data. The incumbent serves as a subject matter expert on STD for internal and external stakeholders and serves as an agency Duty Officer and Epidemiologist-on-Call for two biweekly periods each year.

Responsibilities:

- Works with STD Program Manager and STD specialists to coordinate STD disease surveillance, investigation, prevention and control activities and ensures that case information is accurate, complete and reported in a timely manner
- Assists with the development, preparation, review and distribution of procedures and protocols for STD investigations
- Serve as a subject matter expert for health care providers, local health departments, and the public regarding STD
- Analyze data and prepare and distribute reports and feedback to healthcare providers, local health departments and other partners
- Prepare reports for submission to the CDC by the STD Prevention Program;
- Provide guidance to ISDH program areas, field staff, local health departments, health care providers, schools, and others during STD outbreaks
- Analyze data gathered during epidemiologic investigations using appropriate statistical methods and computer software
- Prepare articles for publication and serve as a media spokesperson when necessary
- Develop and provide assistance in the development of research projects and special studies
- Perform other duties as required

Preferred Experience:

Four (4) years of experience in epidemiology or public health and a Bachelor's degree in a Biological Science, Chemistry, an Environmental or Health Science, Mathematics, Nursing, Pharmacology, Public Health, a Social Science, Statistics, Toxicology, or a closely related area from an accredited college.
