

## Faculty Position in Environmental Health Policy

### Assistant/Associate/Full Professor in Environmental Health Policy

The Department of Environmental Health Sciences in the Fielding School of Public Health at UCLA seeks applicants for a tenure-track/tenured faculty position focused on environmental policy and its impact on health. The position comes with 9 months of state-supported salary.

Solutions to large environmental threats to human and planetary health, ranging from climate change to air and water pollution to toxic exposures and many others, will require evidence-based policy approaches. The Department of Environmental Health Sciences is searching for a faculty member to lead research and teaching about policy approaches to preventing and addressing environmental problems and their impacts on health.

Candidates must hold a doctoral degree (PhD, ScD, DrPH or equivalent) in a relevant discipline, such as public policy, public health policy, environmental economics, environmental health, environmental science and engineering or other relevant field. Candidates must have a track record of research in examining environmental policies and their impact on large populations. Successful candidates must have a strong record of publications and extramural funding consistent with their career stage. Duties include teaching courses and advising students at the masters and doctoral level in the area of environmental health policy while maintaining a vigorous research program.
