Assistant Professor in Global Health

The University of Maryland, College Park, School of Public Health (sph.umd.edu) invites applications for an Assistant Professor (tenure-track) position with expertise and research activities in Global Health.

A successful candidate is expected to conduct research within the area of global public health or global environmental health, preferably in collaboration with ongoing research in the School of Public Health. The School seeks applicants with research interests who can integrate with our existing diverse faculty who have expertise in infectious disease; exposure assessment; maternal and infant health; air and water quality; climate change and sustainability; built environment; health service delivery; and other areas.

The School offers outstanding opportunities for collaboration with a multidisciplinary faculty. Additional research opportunities are enabled by many partnerships with universities and organizations throughout the Baltimore-Washington region, such as the National Institutes of Health, DHHS, DHMH, University of Maryland-Baltimore, Johns Hopkins University, etc.

Qualifications: Candidates for the position should possess a doctoral degree in global health, environmental health, or an associated field. Post-doctoral experience is expected and a history of extramural funding is desired. Applicants must demonstrate evidence of a sustainable and focused research program and a strong publication record. Evidence of teaching, advising, and mentorship experience is desirable.

Responsibilities: A successful candidate will be expected to develop and maintain a nationally-recognized and externally-funded program of original research; teach undergraduate and graduate global health courses; advise, direct and mentor graduate students; and contribute to university and professional service. The successful candidate will have a tenure home within one of the units of the School of Public Health.

Salary: Negotiable, depending upon experience; start-up funds competitive.

Applications: Women and minorities are strongly encouraged to apply. Applications should include the following: 1) cover letter describing qualifications and experience and why this position would be of interest, 2) a curriculum vitae, 3) a statement of research focus including current and planned research, 4) a statement of teaching experience and interest, 5) names of three individuals and contact information who can provide references (to be contacted only with candidate's approval), and 6) copies of the three most significant publications.
